Uniform Detention Policy/Procedure

It is the expectation of our school community Staff, P&C and the SRC that all students attending our school will be dressed in the school uniform. It should be the aim of every student to wear the uniform with pride and to take care of it.

An advantage of being in uniform is that it assists teachers to distinguish between intruders and students making school uniform an issue of increased safety.

The school uniform also denotes the seniority of students to help in identification but also to indicate the increasing levels of responsibility that students are expected to assume as they move into senior roles.

The uniform requirement is as follows:

BOYS	GIRLS
<p>Shirt A collared full button shirt (Midford Style) with a school crest on the pocket.</p> <p>Junior Boys (Years 7-8) wear yellow</p> <p>Middle School Boys (Years 9-10) wear sky blue</p> <p>Senior Boys (Years 11-12) wear white</p> <p>Undershirt White (or yellow/blue/white – matching year shirt colour), with no obvious images or text showing through the school shirt. Undershirts <u>must</u> be tucked in.</p> <p>Pants Grey dress school shorts OR full length grey trousers.</p> <p>Jumpers Navy blue sloppy-joe with the school crest OR navy blue and yellow trim zip-up jacket. School Blazer and tie is optional).</p> <p>Others Items not covered in this policy should be considered to be out of uniform if they detract from the overall look of the uniform. Consideration should be taken for WH&S requirements and religious or cultural traditions.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Offensive slogans or prints on clothing are <u>not acceptable.</u></p>	<p>Shirt A collared full button front shirt (Midford style) lemon in colour with a school crest on the pocket.</p> <p>Junior Girls (Years 7-8) wear yellow</p> <p>Middle School Girls (Years 9-10) wear sky blue</p> <p>Senior Girls (Years 11-12) wear white</p> <p>Undershirt White (or yellow/blue/white matching year shirt colour) with no obvious images or text showing through the school shirt. Undershirts <u>must</u> be tucked in.</p> <p>Skirt or Pants Junior girls - Navy blue box pleat style skirt OR navy blue pants OR navy blue tailored shorts purchased at Moorebank Uniform Shop. Senior girls – Holsworthy tartan box pleat skirt or navy blue pants OR navy blue tailored shorts purchased at Moorebank Uniform Shop.</p> <p>Jumpers Navy blue sloppy-jo with the school crest OR navy blue and yellow trim zip-up jacket. School Blazer (tie is optional).</p> <p>Others Items not covered in this policy should be considered to be out of uniform if they detract from the overall look of the uniform. Consideration should be taken for WH&S requirements and religious or cultural traditions.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Offensive slogans or prints on clothing are <u>not acceptable.</u></p>

Footwear

Totally black leather/suede shoes and laces with white socks.

WH&S requirements - shoes must be totally enclosed leather shoes for all practical classes. Fully enclosed lace-up joggers must be worn for P.E.

Upper Body

Navy blue and gold polo shirt with school logo

Lower Body

Navy blue shorts with school name



Fully enclosed lace-up joggers must be worn for P.E. and Sport.



Students are required to bring their P.E / Sport uniforms on days they have practical sport and/or P.E. classes. Students should wear their full school uniform and get changed for sport and P.E. as directed by the teacher.

Year 9 and 10 students wear their full school uniform to school on Wednesday and change into their full sports uniform for sport after lunch.

The following items are **not** school uniform and should not be worn:

- Any fleecy tracksuit pants or nylon ones.
- Girls wearing tights.
- Coloured jumpers or brand name hoodies
- Jeans, cargo pants, board shorts, polo shirts



When out of uniform

- **Roll call teachers will check uniform during roll call. Student's that are out of uniform are** sent to the Head Teacher in charge of their grade. The Head Teacher will enter students onto the school's 'Out of Uniform' program.
- Throughout the day, any staff member who notices a student being out of uniform can check the student's uniform status on Sentral. Any student not on Sentral but out of uniform should be recorded by the staff member on Sentral.
- The Uniform Coordinator will notify the relevant Year Advisors of students who are regularly out of uniform so that they can conduct a welfare check with both the student and the parent. Year Advisors will enter this check on Sentral under Welfare.
- For students or parents that continue to experience uniform or welfare concerns the Year Advisor should refer the student to the relevant deputy for that year group.

Before Lunch Detention

- Uniform Coordinator will use the 'Out of Uniform' program to generate a 'Sentral' entry for students who are out of uniform three times without a note.
- Students who are out of uniform without a note three times are given a slip informing them of a lunch detention on the day the detention is due (Tuesday, Thursday or Friday).

During Lunch Detention

- Staff on lunch detention duty will date and sign off students who attend.
- Students are NOT permitted to eat during uniform detentions.

After Lunch Detention

- Uniform coordinator will issue 'After school detention' to students who failed to attend the lunch detention after 2 opportunities.
- Head Teacher on Afternoon Detention will resolve or fail (later updated to ARVO Issued) students on Sentral.
- Deputy(s) to follow up on all 'After School Detention' for their year group.
