HSIE CURRICULUM

The HSIE curriculum aims to develop understanding and values knowledge, which enable our students to become informed and active citizens.

In Years 7 – 10 HSIE subjects include:

GEOGRAPHY

Geography students develop skills through fieldwork activities at Cronulla Beach and the Georges River. These activities enable students to use appropriate tools such as a compass and map reading. Senior students learn about biophysical changes in the environment through a visit to Minnamurra Rainforest and Pyrmont. Treasure hunts in Year 7 build on students' map reading skills.

Students focus on two key dimensions:

- 1. Where things are and why they are there (spatial).
- 2. How humans interact with environment (ecological).

Areas of study include:

- Environments Global Change
- Natural Hazards

HISTORY

History aims to stimulate an interest in and enjoyment of exploring the past.

Areas of study include:

- The Ancient World China and Rome
- Medieval Europe knights and castles
- World Wars I and II

The school is fortunate to be able to invite guest speakers, including war veterans, to share their personal experiences with students. History is made relevant to students through activities such as mummy wrapping, creating models and analysing artefacts. The Ancient History class conducted an archaeological dig in the school grounds to examine the role of physical evidence in understanding and reconstructing the past.

History students visit museums and historic sites. Recent museum visits include seeing Egyptian mummies at the Powerhouse Museum and Escape from Pompeii at the Maritime Museum.

The Medieval Show is a highlight for Year 8 when they learn about the life of people during the Middle Ages. Students handle replica armour and weapons, and some willing volunteers even endure the physical punishment of the stocks, pillory and the rack.

COMMERCE

Commerce gives young people the knowledge, and skills to research solutions to consumer, legal, business and employment issues.

Topics of study include: Law and Society **Employment Issues Consumer Choices**

Students create a business which they must organise and be responsible for. The students gain a valuable understanding of the nature of business and the challenges which must be overcome for financial success.

Commerce and Legal Studies students visit the **Downing Centre District Court** and the Supreme Court to observe our legal system.

Students have the opportunity to enter challenging competitions such as The Australian Geography Competition and The **Business Studies Competition.** HSC students attend study days in preparation for their final exams.

Healing Circle

Society and Culture students participated in a Healing Circle to gain a better understanding of the role of rituals in the topic Belief Systems and ideoloav.
