WHY CHOOSE INTERNATIONAL STUDIES?

International Studies provides students with a solid foundation of skills necessary for many senior subjects. The course allows students to develop an understanding of and appreciation for their own culture and the cultures of the world. Students learn about different cultural practices, values and beliefs.

Students will gain an understanding of key concepts including:

- The complex, diverse and dynamic nature of cultures
- The increasing interconnectedness of cultures in the contemporary world
- Respect for the diversity of cultures
- Individual and social responsibility
- Co-operation between and among cultures and groups
- Equity and social justice

Students will be assessed using a range of methods including:

- Research tasks
- Collaborative Projects
- Multimedia Presentations
- Extended Responses
