COURSE ASSESSMENTS

As part of the HSC, students are required to complete an **Independent Research Project** (IRP) related to the course content. This contributes 20% to the final HSC mark in this subject.

This course has a positive impact on other subjects as it teaches the student vital management skills. It is also related to life now and in the future and encourages students to apply existing knowledge from personal experiences to analyse or manage a variety of situations.

To be successful in this subject students must:

- Complete work with effort
- Possess a degree of autonomy
